## Copyrights and Trademarks

The use of logos or content published in other media or on the Web typically requires written permission, or license, from that source. For this reason, the use of ClipArt or other artwork from outside sources is discouraged.

Altering the original the original work does not change the requirement to obtain a license. Alterations are considered derivative works, and still require permission by the copyright holder.

There are some exceptions to the copyright laws when items are used for non-commercial and/or education purposes. If you absolutely want to use a copyrighted piece of art it's best to submit graphics for approval and supply the source.

## ***Copyrights***

You will find the OKDHS Copyright Permission Form located in the forms drive on the OKDHS InfoNet. This form, 16AD007E, is to be used to obtain permission to reproduce or use material on the OKDHS Internet or InfoNet. Once completed, it should be submitted to the OKDHS [Office of Communications](#).

Some examples of copyright law violations are the use of the following:

- Articles from books, magazines, newspapers, flyers, newsletters and other printed media
- Photographs, graphics, artwork, cartoons and logos from Web sites and printed material
- Video images from VHS, DVD, the Internet or other image sources

Of course, OKDHS Staff have license to use original materials, this includes photos, graphics and articles produced by or for OKDHS.

## ***Trademarks***

The OKDHS logo is a legally protected trademark, so it cannot be bootlegged, copied, or used by non-authorized people and organizations outside of Oklahoma state government. The TM that appears on the logo must be used.
